



Bermuda Rose Society – Privacy Policy Summary

The Bermuda Rose Society (hereafter “BRS”) is committed to protecting your personal information. This summary explains, in simple terms, what we collect, why we collect it, and how we use it.

What Information We Collect

We only collect the information needed to run the Society and communicate with members. This may include:

- Your name and contact details (email, phone)
- Membership information
- Photographs taken at BRS events

Our website may collect anonymous statistics such as pages visited or general geographic location. This information does not identify you personally.

How We Use Your Information

We use your information to:

- Manage membership
- Send updates about meetings, events, and BRS news
- Coordinate activities, volunteering, and community support
- Maintain a historical archive related to roses in Bermuda
- Respond to enquiries submitted via our website or forms

We do **not** sell or share your information.

Photographs

Photographs may be taken at BRS events. Unless you instruct to the contrary, identifiable images of you may be published by BRS on their social media or websites. You may opt out of photography at any time.

How We Store and Protect Data

- Personal information is kept only as long as necessary for Society purposes
- Old or unused information is securely deleted



- Access to data is limited to officers and authorised volunteers
- BRS uses dedicated email accounts and standard cybersecurity measures

Your Rights

You may:

- Request to see the information we hold about you
- Ask us to correct inaccurate information
- Withdraw consent for photographs
- Request deletion of your personal data (unless kept for historical record)
